- LOCATION:** Worland, Wyoming, at the Worland Shooting Complex Rifle Range, 61 Land Fill Road, off of fifteen mile road, (Next to the County Land Fill)

- CONTACT:** Advance entry registration is strongly encouraged, but not required. Registrations will be accepted by calling Kody at 307-431-5051, or e-mail Kody Outland, Kody1988@gmail.com
Entries are limited to 32 shooters, however once your match fee is Received your registration is assured.
- ELIGIBILITY:** Any individual familiar with safe firearms practices, and who supports the right of the citizens to keep and bear arms is welcome. All competitors are encouraged to be members of the NRA. New shooters are welcome! Competitors must be legally eligible to own and use firearms.
- MATCH FEES:** Adults, \$45.00
Juniors and Active Duty Military shoot for free.
- CLASSIFICATION:** The NRA Black Powder Target Rifle Classification system will be used. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master Class unless otherwise provided in the rules
- RULES:** Current NRA Black Powder Target Rifle Rules will govern.
- RIFLES:** Rifle (rule 3.1) Military Rifle (rule 3.3) Any safe, original or modern reproduction or custom variety, breech loading rifle designed as a single shot, original or modern muzzle loading rifles.
- SIGHTS:** Rule (3.7) *Metallic* - Any period metallic sights are allowed.
Black Powder Military Rifle - The front and rear sights must be of original design, but may vary in dimensions of rear sight aperture and front sight blade heights. *Telescopic* - Scope tube body to be 3/4" or less in diameter and any ocular or objective lens, ... See Rule (3.7) for more information
- SAFETY** Hearing and Eye protection is required to compete in the match. Use of an "Empty Chamber Indicator" is required, and may be purchased for \$2.00 at registration.

- MATCH DUTIES:** All matches will be squadded, and competitors will be expected to score, and perform pit duties.
- AMMUNITION:** Any Safe Ammo (Rule 3.17) Black Powder or Pyrodex may be used. No gas checks, or metallic jackets No tracer or incendiary projectiles.
- POSITIONS:** (Rule 7.14.1) Any position course.
- TARGETS:** (Rule 4.1,) SR for 200 yards, SR-3 for 300 yards and MR-1, for 600yds.
- CATEGORIES** All shooters will compete together for overall places.
- AWARDS** Three place awarded for overall (plaques) Other awards if there are 5 or more competitors in a category. Certificates will be awarded to class winners as appropriate.
- COURSE OF FIRE:** (Rule 7-16) 60 Shot National Match course “Two” 30 shot match courses of record fire as described below.

(May 20th 2017; 8:AM)

- Match/Event One:** 200 yards 30min, Four Sighters allowed, then 10 shots for record
- Match/Event Two:** 200 yards 30min, Four Sighters allowed, then 10 shots for record
- Match/Event Three:** 300 yards 30min, Four Sighters allowed, then 10 shots for record
- Match/Event Four:** 300 yards 30min, Four Sighters allowed, then 10 shots for record

(May 21st 2017 8am)

- Match/Event Five** 600 yards 30min, Four Sighters allowed, then 10 Shots for record
- Match/Event Six** 600 yards 30min, Four Sighters allowed, then 10 shots for record
- Match/Event Seven:** Aggregate of Matches 1 thru 6 for Overall Match Winners.
- Note:** Extra Sighters may be given to competitors to get on target at 600 yards but all competitors are expected to finish in the 30 minute time limit.

Nice to Know Info: Free cool water, but bring your own food and small snack items to eat during the matches. Dry Camping is available on the range. (No electric or sewer hookup)
